## Pastor's Page

I read an article this morning that used the term "sloppy agape" in reference to how congregations lack clear organization and task delegation. As much as I'd love to help TLC get pristinely organized, I wish more that I'd coined the term "sloppy agape."

Except I would have given it a positive spin. After all, love – and agape is the love of a Christian community – is sloppy. It's riddled with give-and-take, bending the rules, self-sacrifice, blurry boundaries, valid anger, tough forgiveness, intervention, invasion of privacy, exclusive communication, inclusive communication, mushy sentiment, lavish gratitude, tying up ends and falling through cracks, simultaneously celebrating one and stepping on the toes of another. To highlight a little of the process of living together in love.

When the community is together, it's stressful as much as it's delightful. People remark how comfortable they feel in worship at TLC, but at the end of Sunday mornings, I need a nap.

Even so, occasionally I meet a person who avoids worshipping because they feel unworthy. And I wish, oh, I wish that they didn't feel that way and that they could come and witness the sloppy agape of TLC.

Even so, there is nothing more pristinely organized than TLC folks when someone encounters crisis and tums to us for help. Instantly there are Casserole Angels, Prayer Warriors, Leadership Rescuers, arms to hold, hearts to beat, shoulders to cry on. Priorities shift to Other. People appear in the kitchen, in the office, moving tables and chairs. Our sanctuary gets transformed into a dining hall faster than Jesus ascended into heaven (or use a favorite biblical image of your own).

Money accumulates to donate to rescue efforts. The F.I.S.H. barrel fills up. Prayers rise up.

Even so, we are not called to perfect organization. We are called to live lives that give witness to the Love that authored the whole story in the first place and that is loving it through to the end. We are called to agape.

## IN NEED OF PRAYER

Prayers are always in order, particularly as July 9 approaches when South Sudan will become an independent nation. These are days we suggest a focus on the situation of the people of Sudan. Our sisters and brothers in Sudan and around the world are in prayer now. They are praying for peace and self-determination and will continue in prayer until, and after, independence for South Sudan is realized.

Remembering the role prayer played in the days before the January 2011 referendum on self-determination for South Sudan, a number of faith communities will again come together in a Season of Prayer with the people of Sudan in this time. Specifically, we are invited to pray for thirty minutes on:

- Each day from May 20 through 26 when a delegation of Member States of the UN Security Council will visit Africa and spend time in Sudan; and

- Each Friday until July 9 (this would be May 28, June 4, June 11, June 18, June 25, July 2, and July 9).
- In the United States, we are called to pray at 11:00a.m. (EDT); 10:00 a.m. (CDT); 9:00 a.m. (MDT); 8:00 a.m. (PDT). And we have invited our sisters and brothers in Sudan to pray with us at 7:00 p.m. in their country.

Pray at these times or whenever time works for you; pray wherever you are; pray individually or gather with your congregation, ecumenical or interfaith community; pray in any manner you feel comfortable praying.

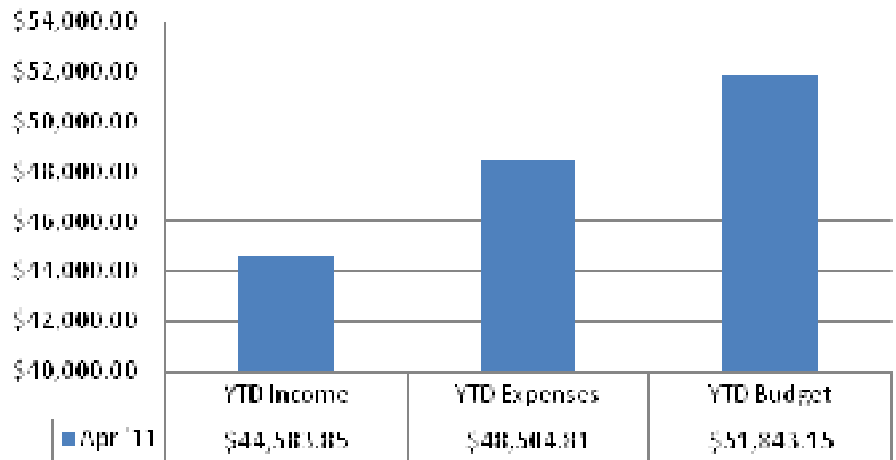


## Finance Report

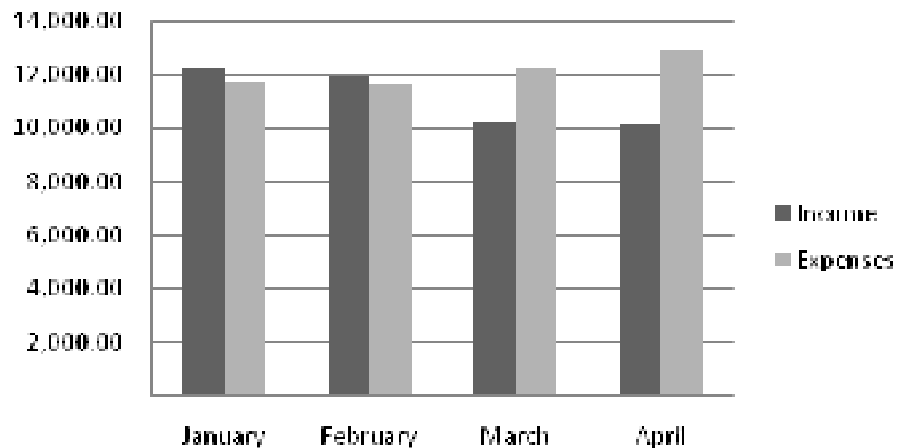
Many thanks go to our members and friends who keep their pledges current and also go that extra mile in their giving. Do remember that our expenses continue over the summer months even as many of our members are on vacation. Please try to give before you leave instead of after you return so that our bills can be paid on a timely basis. Thank you.

Our April expenses were \$2,751.01 greater than our income. The deficit was covered by money in savings but that is dwindling. We need to increase our income. Our expenses were less than what we budgeted for and everyone is being careful but our income just isn't enough. Remember we adopted a deficit budget with an average projected deficit of \$1,661.29. For January-through April our expenses outpaced income by \$3,920.96. May will almost certainly have a deficit also. Please keep this problem in your minds and prayers.

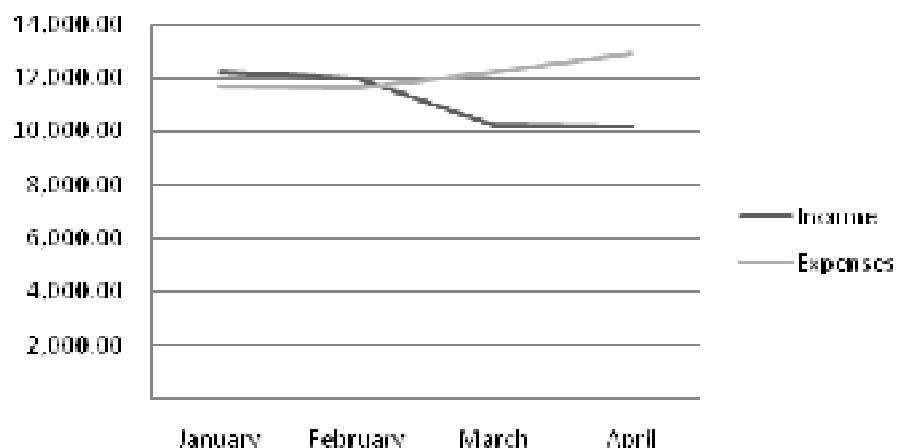

## Worship in the Month of June

June is an Omega-Alpha month! The season of Easter concludes-Pentecost begins. Readings from Acts of the Apostles ends-semi-continuous readings from the patriarchal saga in the Pentateuch begins. The month of June brings a brief end to our following the Revised Common Lectionary-our summer theme "Apocry-Full Summer" will focus on significant extra-biblical writings in The Apocrypha.

In the midweek Bible study (Tuesdays, 1 p.m.) looking at the upcoming Sunday texts ends briefly-a basic study of the Bible begins.\*

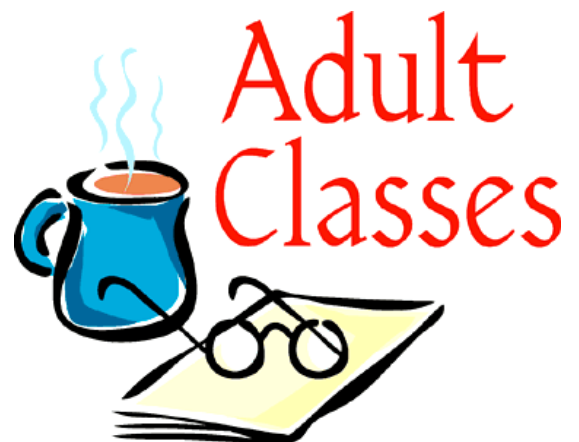
## Basics in Faith Class Well Received

Seven people attended the first session of Pastor's Basics in Faith class, and seven more have expressed interest in also participating. That's a great turnout for this first time around.

The second session will be held on Sunday, June 5, at 8 a.m. in the classroom, and there will be several more sessions during June and July. There are 10 sessions in all, starting at 8 a.m., on 6/12, 6/19, 7/10, 7/17, 7/24

The class covers concepts, creeds, and vocabulary that are frequently encountered in practicing Christianity from a Lutheran perspective. Topics include Means of Grace, biblical authority, the significance of baptism, our heritage, and others.

Pastor Jean's intention is to offer the class once or twice a year for new members and for any member desiring to brush up on the basics. So, if you missed it this time around but are interested, let her know.



## Council Highlights

In April the Council approved changing custodian firms. Thanks to the work of the Property Committee the new firm will clean more for less money. What a deal!

The purchase of water meters for the Community Garden was also approved by Council. This will insure that the gardeners pay only their share of irrigation water. It was difficult before to calculate.
