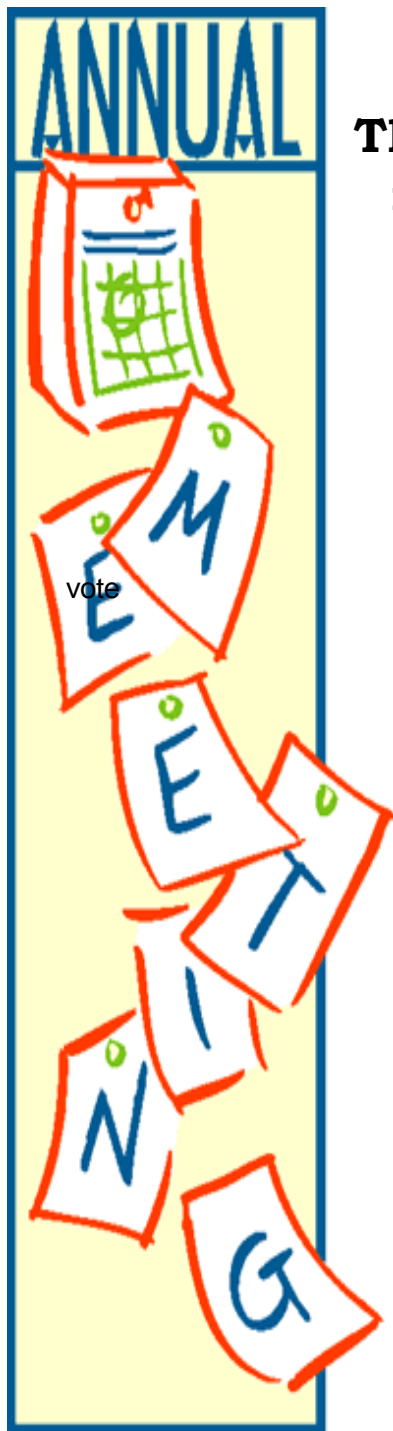

Come Home

This summer I went/came home.

I went home emotionally as I spent a week on a small lake with my best friend since the first day of high school. In some ways, we haven't changed a bit. In others, it was a wonderful time of discovery and growth. We laughed and cried. I rode in the boat watching Sam try to stay on the inner tube while being whipped far outside the wake. As families, we just spent time sitting on the porch, looking at the lake, talking.

I went home physically as I drove around Chicago, remembering pieces of my past. I had dinner with a roommate from college. We visited my cousin and aunt. We watched videos of me and my family. Jim and Sam got to see me as a teen-ager and got to see my mom as she was with her family. The 'going home' was particularly poignant as we came down the hill to see Hudson Lake, Indiana, where I spent most of my summers as a kid. I went to the cottage we once owned. I walked down the cement stairs to the lake. We drove the road that was so spooky and dark those nights I walked it as a teen-ager. I took some seed pods with me from plants my mother had planted 40 years ago. They sit on my dresser in a little bag, waiting. I'm a little afraid they won't grow.

Yet in the midst of all this 'going home' I found as we boarded our plane, that I was, without a doubt 'coming home'. I even confess that as I wandered around the Windy City, I found myself preferring San Francisco (a shocking and unexpected shift that causes me to feel vaguely traitorous).

Home is a powerful image that evokes strong feelings — hopefully, but not always, positive. Ideally, home is safe, warm, familiar, comfortable — the place where you can be fully yourself even while you experiment with who you are becoming. Home can be more than one place with more than one family. Which brings me to the very subject you knew was coming: your church home and your church family.

My hope and prayer is that each and every one of you is planning to come home to church. Many of you were already planning to do just that. You were home last week or the week before and you'll be back this week or the next. Some of you may have been away a little longer. Maybe you need to hear that there's a family reunion — it happens weekly. You're welcome, you're missed.. Sometimes a person needs to be invited to come home. If you need to be invited, you are.

Occasionally, like in the old days when the street lights go on, a person needs to be called home. Okay. Listen. It's your name. You're being called. It's time to come home.

We're growing. We're changing. New people are joining the family. The furniture is being moved around or changed all together. How we spend our week is shifting. But it's still home — your home. And it's time for supper. So come home.

See you soon.

The Nifty 50+ Club will be attending this movie, Winner of the Audience Award for Best Documentary at the Seattle International Film Festival, as its November activity. This provocative and entertaining documentary is so important that all members and friends of TLC are invited to join the Nifty 50+ in viewing this film. The plan is to meet next door to the theater at Mary's Pizza at 5 PM and then go to the movie after eating together. Starting time is 7:15 PM. We expect this one-time showing to be sold out, so we plan to purchase tickets early. **Please call Paul & Ingrid at 838-8964 to let them know if you will attend the gathering at Mary's Pizza prior to the movie or just the movie.** Tickets are \$9.50 (\$6.50 for seniors 65 and above). 'Through the experiences of five very normal, very Christian, very American families — including those of former House Majority Leader Richard Gephardt and Episcopalian Bishop Gene Robinson — we discover how insightful people of faith handle the realization of having a gay child. Informed by such respected voices as Bishop Desmond Tutu, Harvard's Peter Gomes, Orthodox Rabbi Steve Greenberg and Reverend Jimmy Creech, FOR THE BIBLE TELLS ME SO offers healing, clarity and understanding to anyone caught in the crosshairs of scripture and sexual identity.'

The film is for Christian straight friends and families. It fills the need of people just like the members and friends of TLC who have friends who are gay. We all know that our gay friends are gifts of God to us and to our congregation. We know that it is a lie when Christian preachers condemn gay people to hell. This film teaches us the words to say when a religious person quotes THE BIBLE in an attempt to stop further conversation on the subject. One of the families in the film, Jake Reitan and his parents, we met at Churchwide Assembly in Indianapolis in 2001, I think. I can't wait to see and hear Bishop Gene Robinson's parents tell what they learned from the son they gave birth to who went on to become the Bishop Gene Robinson that the whole Christian world talks about. What can we learn from them that will help us talk about our friends and family members who just happen to be gay?

The Columbia space shuttle's guidance system only kicks in when it's several miles up in space. What's the point? God's guidance system kicks in when you're in motion. That means you've got to get off the launching pad! Are you stuck in the same spot praying "Lord, I won't make a move until I hear from You," while He's saying, "you'll hear from Me once you've done what I've already put before you to do?" Sometimes we know what God wants, but we don't like it. So we pray hoping He'll change His mind and rubber-stamp what we desire.

The Bible says, "By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and went, even though he did not know where he was going". When you follow God you'll go out not knowing as much as you'd like to. Counselors, study groups, committees, business plans and projections notwithstanding, there comes a time when you have to move in the direction God is pointing. Will you have unanswered questions and unspoken concerns? Absolutely. Just like your car's headlights don't shine around the next corner or over the next hill, God will give you directions on an 'as need to know' basis. That's why Paul writes: "We walk by faith, not by sight". Actually, it's the only way to go! It keeps you close to God, dependent on Him, and helps you remember Who the credit for all your successes belong to. And by the way, God's guidance system usually takes a lifetime to learn.

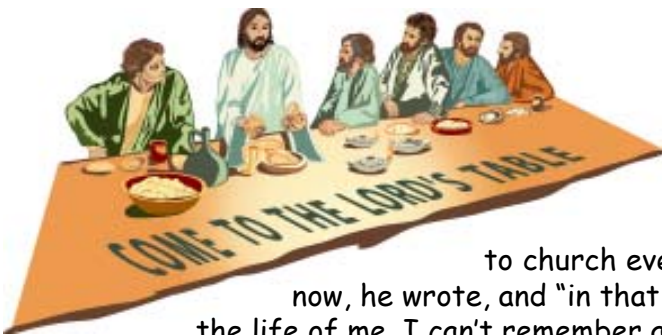

Abraham Lincoln

gave his second Inaugural Address on March 4, 1865, as the Civil War was raging. He said, “Fondly do we hope -ferventlydo we pray - that this mighty scourge of war may speedily pass away.”

Lincoln’s next paragraph is especially appropriate for Veterans Day:

“With malice toward none; with charity for all; with firmness in the right, as God gives us to see the right, let us strive on to finish the work we are in; to bind up the nation’s wounds; to care for him who shall have borne the battle, and for his widow and his orphan — to do all which may achieve and cherish a just and lasting peace, among ourselves, and with all nations.”

When President Lincoln finished his classic oration, he reportedly kissed the Bible and left the platform. He was assassinated the next month.
