## Pastor's Page

**F**all is my favorite season.

As I write that, it occurs to me that there isn't a sense of changing seasons in Bible stories and hardly a mention of weather. Even in the Wandering stories in Exodus and Numbers – I always picture the Hebrews wandering in the exact same arid, sunny clime, never slogging through the rain, shivering in the snow, peering through thick fog, frolicking in spring's floral flaunting, or even dripping with sweat caused by summer heat. The only time someone sits and sweats is when they are sweating out a spiritual dilemma.

The stories are bereft of details, like weather, names, emotions, descriptions, so that they serve as "one story fits all," all who crawl into them to encounter God. They are invitingly stark, so that you can fill in the details with your own life, your

own need, your own seeking. And encounter the Spirit you need.

This month in worship at TLC, the stories of the Wandering in the Wilderness will come to their end, at Deuteronomy and the edge of the Promised Land. We have a couple more of Jesus' parables from the 22<sup>nd</sup> chapter of Matthew. There's an emphasis on the Law this month, beginning on Sinai, when Yahweh gives the Ten Commandments to Moses and concluding in Matthew 22, when Jesus squeezes the whole Law (to get a sense of how the Law starts expanding after the first Ten, keep reading after Exodus 20 and right on into Leviticus) into the halves of a single nutshell: "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart and soul and mind" (one half) "And your neighbor as yourself" (t'other half).

I will be gone a little bit this month. Gonna

I have always believed that it is no great crime to talk about money in church! The trick is to do it without making everyone feel guilty. Let's see if I can accomplish that.

First of all, we have not had as bad a year thus far as we thought we might have. We passed an unbalanced budget at our annual meeting expecting that things would be really dire. But they are not as dire as we thought it might be. See how I am trying not to pile on any guilt! How am I doing? Our less dire situation is in part because many of you chose last year to increase your pledge. Think about how that went for you, did all your bills get paid, did you have food on the table, did you do something fun once in awhile, did you feel good about your pledge?

Flak and I increased our pledge by \$25 a month last year. It was a bit of a stretch for a couple of months and then it didn't matter anymore. I can't really tell you what we have given up as a result of that increase. I hope that those of you who increased your pledge had the same experience. This year we would like to do

the same thing. Here's the deal - our income has gone down the last 2 years by 15% and may go down again for next year. We are making some changes in our expenses for next year and so we think that we can increase our pledge. I think it's a step in faith.



There is no question in my mind that this is a scary time for all of us. Congress isn't helping much to take the scare away. Perhaps you like me have had a sleepless night or two trying to figure out how you are going to survive all this.

I challenge you all to keep your eye on the goal of helping TLC be a welcoming, worshipful, caring community. Help us to reach out to the surrounding community, to support those in our community and world. You can make a difference! What would happen if each of our pledges was raised by \$1, \$5, \$10 or more - what would we really have to give up? What would we gain?

This is what I think - we are a great, faithful people, loved by God, who can respond in many ways to our call to be a died for follower. It's up to each of us how we will choose to respond - what will your response be?

### Finance News

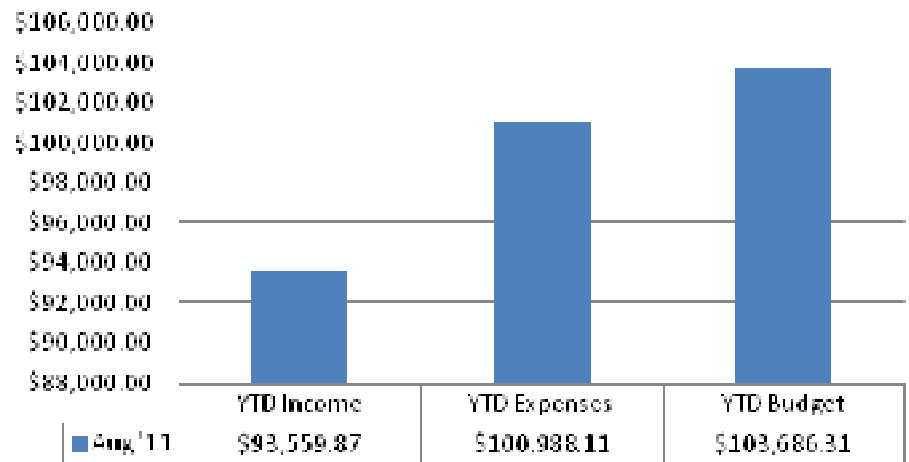

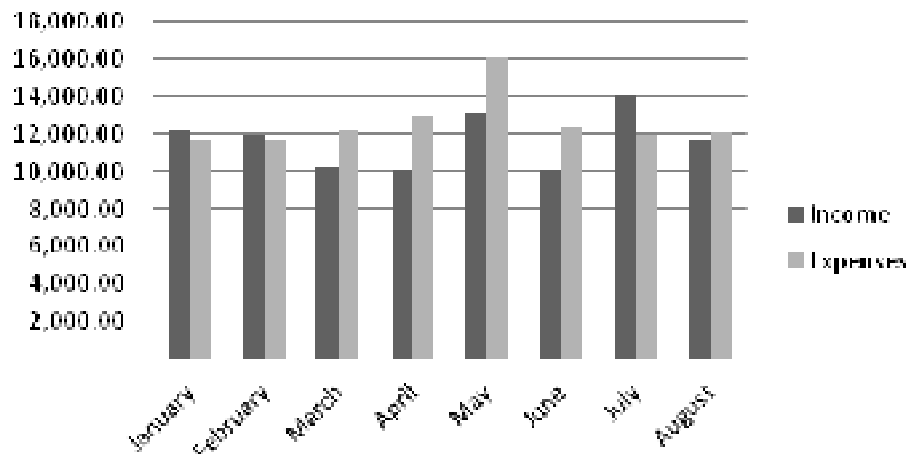
### Our gifts

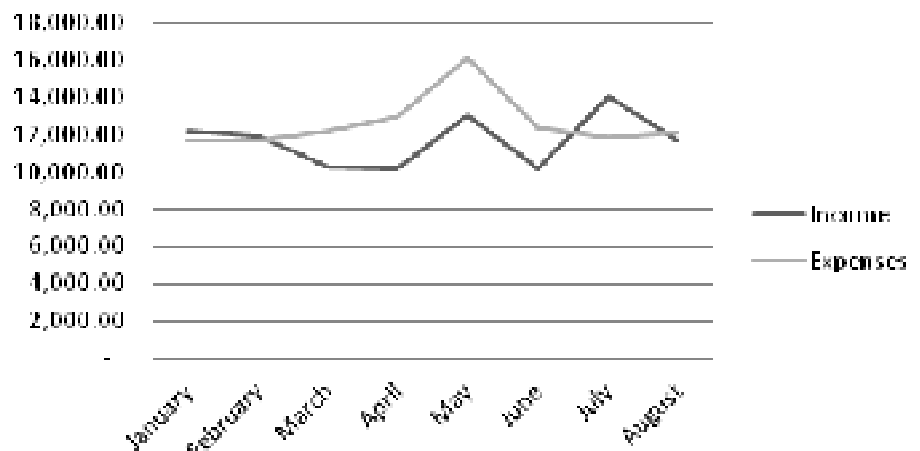
